## Fifty Years Ago in Johnston

Fifty years ago Johnston was an unincorporated community. It had no city government. Initiatives to improve the community were spearheaded by the Johnston Lions Club. Police protection was provided by the Polk County Sheriff's Department. There were no stop lights, only a few stop signs, and no speed limit. Merle Hay Road was made of brick and most other roads were dirt or gravel. The county maintained the roads with a road grader. Most homes received their water from wells located on their property. Trains ran on the interurban track which ran parallel to the high school football field and behind the Dairy Sweet. There were no fast food restaurants although you could order hot dogs and hamburgers at the Dairy Sweet. Pizza was available only in Des Moines.

The Johnston High School class of 1962 had 49 graduates. They attended kindergarten through grade 12 in the same building. Charles Varner was the superintendent and Jack Sims was the principal. Girls played half-court basketball and took Home Ec; boys took shop. The chalk boards were made of slate and the worksheets smelled of mimeograph fluid. Al's Texaco was located next to the school and housed Irene's Ice Cream Shop. Students could walk to the shop during their lunch period and order ice cream or buy candy.

## Johnston's Developing Bridge Between Preschool and Kindergarten

The Johnston school district is working to create a developmental kindergarten, or pre-kindergarten, program to kick off in the fall.

The program would be used as a bridge between four-year old preschool and kindergarten for students whose parents would like more time before traditional kindergarten.

The school thinks that the program will gain a lot of interest as 24 families were already planning to open enroll in a similar program in Dallas Center Grimes before Johnston announced this program.

## City News

In August 2011, 82% of Johnston voters approved building a public safety building and a second fire station. Several meetings have gone on since that time. The public safety building will be located at Merle Hay Road and NW 64th place. The second fire station annex will be located at 103rd St and NW 62nd Ave. It is expected that the second fire station annex will be completed and in service by the end of the year. The public safety building will be completed in the spring of 2013. It is also expected that the city will hire 3 career firefighters/EMTs to work at the new second fire station. Both buildings were designed by members of the Johnston police and fire departments. We will continue to provide updates on the project as it moves forward.

The historical society is looking to find history on Johnston's public safety over the years. If you know any history, or have any photos or articles, please let us know.

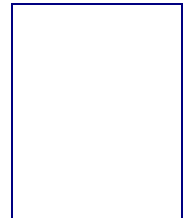
